- 3. The Kettle, Directions and Partner Update

a. WEBIA

- i. A few meetings gave been held to address the issue of sidewalk sleepers, people sleeping in underground parkades and in business' doorways.
- ii. Aggression among street people seems to be increasing. In response new security has been hired to patrol 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. to identify hot spots and collect data
- iii. West Valley Produce has been closed and there was a farewell party. They will be missed.
- b. St. Andrew's- Wesley United Church
 - i. Senior's lunch every Wednesday.
 - ii. The church has welcomed a seven member Syrian refugee family.
 - iii. Cheque for \$300.00 will be given to Kettle on Burrard for the gardening program.

c. Directions

- i. Year-end stats indicate slight decrease in individual and overall visits to the centre.
- ii. Supporting people with fentanyl addiction- 15 reported deaths across all Directions' Youth Services sites.
- iii. One OD in the centre recently and 4 OD's discovered in the alley behind the building
- iv. Night in the Life fundraiser was recently held. There were 11 participants in the homelessness simulator and four joined the sleep out. Over \$20K was raised.
- v. The winter shelter closed on April 15 and 19 youth were housed.

d. WECH CPC

- i. Increase in loitering complaints and open drinking in and around the area
- ii. Merchants complaining of increase in shoplifting
- iii. Receiving complaints from local residents about people riding their bikes on the sidewalks- danger to seniors and others.

e. WECAN

- i. Members report encampments of homeless people, not just individuals but 3-5 people.
- ii. Seniors concerned around their personal safety

f. WESN

- i. Crisis around housing for seniors. Great need for subsidized housing. Market housing tends to discriminate even with SAFER subsidy.
- ii. Safety complaints at Denman Mall. There has been occasional lockdowns at Kay's Place because of this. A security office has been hired back at the mall.
- iii. There is a new pain management group and peer support group.
- iv. Some issues with particular homeless senior who likes to sleep at Barclay Manor drop-in.

g. BC Housing

- i. 4 Temporary winter shelters funded by BC Housing opened and over the winter and now closing for the season. There were 110 mats this year.
- ii. Overall there are about 900 staying in shelters in Vancouver.
- iii. 24 hour wellness checks being conducted at supportive housing sites.

h. VPD

i. Quarterly Security and safety meetings to commence to share info on issues in the downtown core.

i. The Kettle

- i. Celebrating 3 years in operation next month.
- ii. Active response to the fentanyl crisis. 3 tenants and 2 guests have passed away from overdose since December. Most OD's are revived by fellow tenants and/or staff. Conducting a rolling 24 hour wellness check to account for every tenant.
- iii. Kettle on Burrard community very stable with 60% of original tenants still housed.
- iv. Spring gardening starting up again and many thanks to St. Andrew's Wesley Church for the financial contribution.

- v. Partnership with Vancouver Opera going well and the choir and writing group will be showcased on May 10, 2017 at 4:30 at Queen Elizabeth plaza during the Opera Festival.

Updates since the meeting:

VPD

- 1. Bikes along Denman Street sidewalks- The VPD Targeted Enforcement Team will be conducting enforcement and education.
- 2. Continued sleeping under the Royal Bank on Denman Street This item has been a work in process for some time and we will continue to work with WEBIA, the property owner and the RBC.
- 3. Awning at recently closed grocery store- This will be monitored by the Neighbourhood Policing Team.
- 4. General concerns regarding feelings of safety, homelessness, and shoplifting As mentioned a public safety symposium/seminar is being planned. Once details are made available I will advised the CAC and ensure that the CAC partners can communicate this event to their constituents.
